As many of you know, once we left Spain we knew we'd be moving into a new phase of life. We left our former apartment due to the fact that we had come to

the decision that Maria's father was going to move in with us.

However, by the time we got back to Spain we still hadn't heard from the realtor working to help us. So for the first few weeks in Spain, we stayed with Maria's father which is 7 hours north of our church plant.

We were prayerfully asking God to provide an apartment. Every time we got close to closing the deal on renting an apartment we hit some pretty hard walls from the realtors. This was due to the fact that our income comes from outside Spain, which means the realtors had less assurance of our commitment to paying long term. We came close to closing the deal with an apartment even though it was in the next town over from where we were ministering.

This apartment required climbing stairs (not ideal for my father-in-law) and it was more than we had hoped to spend, but with limited options we attempted to move forward.

However, God had other plans in store. We again got turned down for the apartment.

One afternoon a new apartment popped up. It was more than perfect. It was a first floor, it costed less than the other apartment we were looking at, it was fully furnished, and most importantly it was located in our town of Velilla de San Antonio. We quickly booked a viewing, and jumped on the next train to Madrid from her dad's place. We were able to see the apartment and it was everything we hoped it would be. However, we knew that the possibility that the same wall that was put up at all the other places that we had looked into was sure to happen again. We were very skeptical about the possibility of them accepting us, and we were sure they would tell us the same as the rest due to our income

situation. In any case we prayed, and prayed... The next thing we knew ... God answered, **and we are now in our new home!!** God graciously made sure we would be turned down from the other options because He had something better in store. To minister in a Spanish pueblo **is** to live in that pueblo, and God knowing this answered above and beyond our expectations.

But what happened to our church while in the US?

God never ceases to remind us who is really building HIS church!

As you may remember, through your support and prayers, God made possible the opportunity to open up a store front, where we are able to publicly gather and worship . This serves as well as a base for our ministry.

While in the states, two of our teammates, with the help of my father-in-law, Pere, held worship services as well as hosted woman's bible studies and kid centered events for the families in town.

When Maria and I got back we were able to see with our own eyes how God had multiplied our few loaves of bread and fish.... as you can see below we have expanded even more, and there are now at least three or four new attendees on Sunday to hear of our God and the gospel of His Son and worship with us!!!



We are now happily on our way to baptizing, (you heard right, BAPTIZING!!) at least 3 Spaniards in our congregation.



Maria and I have been able to help out along with a few interns who have come to Spain with World Team, with the family events for the town. Here we do everything from face painting for kids, games, and snacks, but most importantly we explain the gospel, for kids and adults alike, through Bible stories.

Please continue to pray as Maria and I get back into the swing of things and that her father's transition to Madrid goes smoothly, hopefully in a few weeks.

Please pray for Maria's health . She has recently been diagnosed with a chronic migraine issue and is going to be having a radio frequency treatment soon. Pray that her constant pain would be relieved and that she would be able focus on her exams coming next month for her online schooling.
